Adapted to beginners and also higher levels, for a short or long stay, you will find the class best-suited to you. To ensure you learn French in the right conditions, we suggest the centres labelled "qualité FLE" (FFL quality). This certification for French training centres is a guarantee of quality linguistic training. You will find the list of these centres on the catalogue of short programmes and summer schools published by Campus France.  You can also choose to learn French at the university, in the ADCUEFE's Campus FLE network of university centers for French as a foreign language. In order to access housing, it is compulsory that you are "sup-ported" by a guarantor. Finding a guarantor A guarantor is someone who provides security on your behalf, that is, someone who agrees to pay your rent in the event you can no longer do so. In France, nearly everyone seeking to rent an apartment, whether French or foreign, is asked to name a guarantor. Your guarantor must be French. If you don't have one, other solutions are possible, thanks to the VISALE system, which provides rental guarantees if you are renting an apartment or room in a university residence. We advise you to begin the VISALE process as soon as possible—even before arriving in France. You don't have to know your address in France to obtain a certificate of eligibility for VISALE (known as a "VISALE visa").  A few tips:  Don't wait until you arrive in France to look for housing. Submit your applications remotely, whether for a room in a hostel, or a private home.  -Look for furnished rentals. You'll save on move-in expenses.  -Never send money remotely until you've signed a rental agreement and had direct exchanges with a property owner or agent.  - Avoid paying rent in advance.	
Health insurance	https://www.campusfrance.org/en/healthcare-student-social-security If you come to study in France, you are considered as residing for a temporary stay and should normally be registered with the health insurance scheme in your country of origin. Before your departure, you should always verify that this scheme will cover your medical expenses throughout the entire duration of your stay in France. If so, you can use your European health insurance card in France. If not, you should contribute to the French social security student scheme or take out private insurance in your country or in France: https://heyme.care/en/foreign-student	
Other practical information	Opening a bank account: If you wish to open a bank account in France, you only need to provide the chosen bank with proof of identity and proof of address (a residence permit is not required).
